Teaching Life Skills and Empowering Students

Fast Track & S.K.I.L.L.S. Programs

Our Fast Track & S.K.I.L.L.S. Programs are flourishing. From July 1, 2023 to April 15, 2024, DRC taught over 700 individual services combined. Consumers learned skills such as Pre-Employment Transition Services, Self Advocacy, Post Secondary Education, Work Place Readiness, Work Based Learning, and Job Exploration Counseling. The Fast Track Program is taught in a classroom environment and will compliment your child's school curriculum.

The Community Connections Program is for students with disabilities 18-22 years of age that aren't enrolled in a Transition Program through their local school district. This is a free and non-accredited course that allows students to obtain an on-campus college experience. Consumers learn Independent Living Skills such as Self-Advocacy, Work Readiness Training, Job Exploration, and Work Based Learning Skills.

Lessons focus on providing students with information for living and working independently within the community. Topics include obtaining and maintaining employment, building healthy relationships, teamwork, leadership, and communication.

Participants will be registered as Lewis students and are issued an ID and email address. Students can also participate in all clubs, sports, and events open to enrolled students.

From July 1, 2023 to April 15, 2024, **107 amplified phones or devices** were distributed by our office to consumers with hearing loss.

DRC has helped more Illinois residents with hearing loss obtain free amplified telephones, cell phones, and answering machines than any other selection center in the state. We are the # 1 distributor of 47 selection centers in Illinois!

ITAC provides FREE amplified telephones and other equipment to all qualifying Illinois residents with hearing loss regain telephone usage. DRC is an official ITAC selection center where consumers can schedule an appointment to test different equipment to find the best amplified phone for their needs.

Success Stories

Joliet Junior College Community Connections Program is designed to assist individuals with disabilities 18–22 years old with learning Independent Living Skills. The program is designed to assist students in preparing for life after high school. Lesson focus on advocacy, housing, banking/budgeting, healthy eating, community safety, medication management, and more. Students receives support from an Independent Living Advocate to help plan their futures based on their dreams and goals. One of our current students "D.R." expressed interest in renting an apartment to live on her own. She did not think her dream could come true due to her income. DRC Independent Living Advocates were able to assure D.R. that her dream was attainable. D.R. was placed on an affordable housing database and was recently selected for a brand new unit with income based rent. D.R. is very excited about moving into her first place.

Highlights from July 1, 2023 to April 15, 2024

Advocacy:

Staff assisted 380 consumers with Advocacy related issues.

Information and Referral:

Staff assisted 1866 people with information and referral inquiries.

Transition Services:

The Center has had 2 successful nursing home move outs to date

Housing:

146 individual services for people with disabilities find housing, assist with utilities, security deposit, and first month's rent through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

293 individuals were referred to the Statewide Referral Network.

Highlights from July 1, 2023 to April 15, 2024

Assistive Technology for Children Program:

38 consumers (0-23 years old) with disabilities received an assistive technology device that helped them to participate more fully in their lives.

Peer Counseling:

DRC has 7 support groups.
